Yes, my friends, the two wars and the recession are accoutrements of the White House, as much as a presidential limousine, the Secret Service and a White House chef. President Obama knew about them and he knew about the two wars and a recession.

It was not “constructive knowledge” either — it was actual knowledge. As a member of the U.S. Senate, he had voted on providing funds for both the troops and the recession.

That means Senator Obama had a senatorial staff working to keep him informed on a daily basis of the facts at a level that few of the people who elected him to office had available to them.
